

Police and Crime Commissioner for Wiltshire and Swindon Angus Macpherson launched a £1 million Innovation Fund on 7 June.

The Commissioner is looking to fund community and voluntary initiatives throughout Wiltshire and Swindon which will help towards achieving his six main priorities as set out in his Police and Crime Plan.

The Commissioner's six main priorities are, working with communities are partners to:

- Reduce crime and anti-social behaviour
- Protect the most vulnerable in society
- Put victims and witnesses first
- Reduce offending and re-offending
- Drive up standards of customer service
- Ensure unflinching and timely response to calls for assistance.

The funding will be awarded in three tranches as follows:

- £400,000 by 31 July 2013 in respect of applications received by 15 July 2013
- £300,000 by 30 November 2013 in respect of applications received by 15 November 2013
- £300,000 by 31 March 2014 in respect of applications received by 15 March 2014.

Any organisation with aims and activities that meet the criteria can apply for funding. Any funds not awarded in one tranche will be 'rolled-over' to the next funding tranche.

The £1 million Innovation Fund is being funded from Office of the PCC reserves. The Commissioner will consult with an advisory panel, made up of representatives from Wiltshire Police, Wiltshire Council, Swindon Borough Council and The Community Foundation for Wiltshire and Swindon, before deciding which applications to fund.

1: Burglaries:


Shed and Garage Break-ins

In recent weeks, we have seen a spike in the number of garages and sheds being broken into throughout the county, many of which have been in Pewsey and surrounding villages.

Seasonal crime prevention advice:

- Never leave a shed or garage unlocked, even when you are gardening and especially if it has a connecting door to the house
- Lock tools and ladders away so a thief cannot use them to break in
- Consider the use of security lighting around your property
- Make sure any hedging at the front of your property is not too high to allow a burglar to work unnoticed
- Mark all valuable items with your postcode and the number of your property
- Don't leave valuable items on obvious display
- Make sure you have up-to-date contents insurance.

If you notice anything suspicious, call us immediately (not the following day as it will be too late) we patrol 24/7 and you will not be wasting our time.



Don't make it easy for a thief to steal from your shed

SHUT IT, LOCK IT, KEEP IT

- Make sure all doors are fitted with good quality locks and lock them
- Fit wire mesh to the inside of garden shed windows
- Clearly mark all your garden and power tools
- Photograph valuable and unusual garden ornaments and keep these in a secure place
